Can buy a physical card or a digital version (download the Tap app) TAP card

Transit App Download the "Transit" app for real-time schedules and route maps - very convenient

One way fare \$1.75 . 2 hour free transfers for metro

> Fare capping means you never pay more than a certain amount for rides within a specific time Once you pay that amount called a "cap," all rides on Metro buses and trains are free.

2 capping options: 1 day and 7 day https://www.metro.net/about/farecapping/

1 day pass: Spend \$5 and the rest of the day is free

7 day pass: Spend \$18 and the rest of the week is free
The math: 1 day pass is 3 one way fare rides. 7 day pass is 11 rides. Considering the commute between all
events for the 5 days we have together - I recommend the 7 day pass for the best value



FlyAway Bus

From the airport, you can take the flyaway coach bus to either Union Station or Van Nuys (the valley)
Exit to ground transportation, find the blue and white banner pillars that say FlyAway, and wait there for the

Route

One way fare is \$9.75. You can pay with credit card, tap, swipe, or insert on the device inside the bus

Metro Train

Metro route

Exit to ground transportation, find the pillars that say Shuttle to Metro and wait there for the next one Shuttle route

Shuttle is FREE. You will be dropped off at Aviation/LAX metro stop (the green line)

Fare One way fare on metro is \$1.75

Take green line toward Norwalk, stop at Willowbrook/Rosa Parks station, go up the stairs

Take the connecting blue line

- if you're going to Long Beach, stay on the Long Beach side

- if you're going to Union Station, stay on the Azusa/APU side

Est. time 1.5 - 2 hrs

Cheap, can use your day passes on TAP card, see more LA neighborhoods / Takes longer, it's a public Pros/Cons

metro, safety, advising only to use in daylight unless with a group
